THE PASTOR'S VOICE

In the good ole summertime...wait a minute. It's only 60 degrees outside. Is this June in Western PA? I seem to recall June being hot, but not yet too sticky—at least that's the way it was when I was a boy. I'm not interested in fighting about the cause; I just want my warm June days to return.

We Christians are very good at fighting about the cause of those things we don't like. I get it. I just don't agree with it as a standard practice. I've come to understand that there are no second chances on yesterday, so trying to affix blame is a waste of time and spirit. If something needs to change, seek consensus and then follow the process created to effect that change. Spend your creativity and energy on the solution, not the problem maker.

Resistance to change is a natural response for most folks. There is great comfort in the familiar, even if it is an undesirable state. That is how any organization (or society) begins to self-destruct—far too much time spent looking backward and not enough looking ahead. Our American culture is (and has been) unraveling for many years, although sometimes making positive changes, but mostly just throwing out what we know about the past instead of placing it in proper perspective as a guide for avoiding future missteps. The way we change has to...change!

Our church (HUMC) is starting to recognize

the need for some fundamental changes in what ministries we support. Last month I referenced the drop in the number of children we typically serve. It is a fact, so we must accept it and look ahead. Our mission to share the Good News does not ever change, but the means of doing so must.

For instance, we have recognized a need in our community for a safe, comfortable and judgement-free gathering place for veterans and their families to be in fellowship with one another. So we've launched weekly Kay's Kitchen Veterans Gathering Place meetings in the Fellowship Hall and classrooms. We're just getting this ministry off the ground, so not much progress to report just yet.

Here are some other needs we might hold some prayerful discussion about:

- Grief Sharing Group, open to the community.
- Grandparents raising grandchildren is more frequent than ever before. What can we do to help them?
- An Opioid Loss Support group, open to the community.
- Homeless veterans temporary housing. It sounds like a big project (and it is), but we need to get something started.

What ideas do you have? How can we make a positive difference in the lives of those around and among us? How do we share Jesus with a world in pain? Let's get busy.

The chart on the right tells the tale of the proverbial double-edged sword. In comparing 2016 Jan-Apr giving with 2017 Jan-Apr giving, overall we are up by 11.49%. But looking behind the numbers, we see that giving which supports operational expenses of the church (non-designated monies) has gone down. While it is a true blessing to have your strong support for the many varied ministries of HUMC, we also need to continue to meet our operational expenses.

 - Getting security cameras installed at the south entrance door so we are aware of whom is entering the building.






