

Passing Through

269 years ago, George Washington passed through what is now Harrisville and Forestville on Christmas Day. I'm sure some of you remember this. ;) Washington was only 21 at the time and a major in the Virginia militia. He was returning from his mission to deliver a letter to the French commander at Fort LeBoeuf (near what is Waterford, PA today). It was a dangerous mission through what was primarily Indian territory. The letter demanded that the French vacate the "Ohio Country" because "the Lands upon the River Ohio in the Western Parts of the Colony of Virginia are so notoriously known to be the Property of the Crown of Great Britain."

How important was this mission? Well, tensions continued to rise between the French and the British until, less than a year later, troops led by then Colonel Washington, along with several Mingo Indians, ambushed French Canadian troops led by Joseph Coulon de Villiers de Jumonville. Jumonville was killed. This began the French and Indian War, which lasted 9 years. This incident took place at what is now called Jumonville Glen, in Fayette County, PA, only a stone's throw away from our United Methodist Camp Jumonville (named for the fallen officer).

Why do I mention any of this? To remind us how things constantly change – and to remind us to make the most of things while we can. I'm reminded of the 70s hit, "We May Never Pass This Way (Again)", by the musical duo, Seals & Crofts. George Washington never passed this way again. The Seneca tribe, who used this area for growing corn during the time Washington passed through, was edged out and have never passed this way again. The trail upon which Washington trod was paved over and became Route 8. It will never be seen again. Things change, things change, things change.

This is always crucial to remember, especially at this time of year when we conspicuously note the passage of time from one year to the next. Tempus fugit! Time flies!

And, in the context of this awareness, it's essential to prioritize. In the words of the English poet and mystic, William Blake:

He who binds to himself a joy

Does the winged life destroy

He who kisses the joy as it flies

Lives in eternity's sunrise

In other words, we can't live in the past. We have to make the most of things while we can and then move on.

What do you need to let go of? What do you need to do before the opportunity to do it is gone? How will you seize the day, the week, the month, the year, your life?!

Carpe diem! Seize the day! We may never pass this way again!





JERUSALEM — The Israel Antiquities Authority, the Israel National Parks Authority and the City of David Foundation announced days before the new year that the Pool of Siloam, a biblical site cherished by Christians and Jews, will be open to the public for the first time in 2,000 years in the near future.

"The Pool of Siloam's excavation is highly significant to Christians around the world," American Pastor John Hagee, the founder and chairman of <u>Christians United for Israel</u>, told Fox News Digital. "It was at this site that Jesus healed the blind man (John:9), and it is at this site that, 2,000 years ago, Jewish pilgrims cleansed themselves prior to entering the Second Temple.

"The Pool of Siloam and the Pilgrimage Road, both located within the City of David, are among the most inspiring archeological affirmations of the Bible.

A small section of the pool, which has been fully excavated, has been accessible to the public for several years. The vast majority of the pool is being excavated and will either be opened piecemeal or once the entire site is unearthed.

The pool was first built roughly 2,700 years ago as part of Jerusalem's water system in the eighth century B.C. The construction unfolded during the reign of King Hezekia as cited in the Bible in the Book of Kings II, 20:20, according to the two Israeli agencies and the City of David Foundation.

The pool was revealed the pool in 2004 when infrastructure work carried out by the Hagihon water company uncovered some of the pool's steps. The Israel Antiquities Authority (IAA), under supervision of professors Roni Reich and Eli Shukron, launched a survey. As a result, the northern perimeter, as well as a small section of the eastern perimeter of the Pool of Siloam, were uncovered.

"The perimeter of the pool was built as a series of steps, allowing the bathers to sit and immerse themselves in the waters of the pool," according to the IAA.

Mayor of Jerusalem Moshe Lion, said, "The Pool of Siloam in the City of David National Park in Jerusalem is a site of historic, national and international significance. After many years of anticipation, we will soon merit being able to uncover this important site and make it accessible to the millions of visitors visiting Jerusalem each year."

Some Facts About Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI

- Pope Benedict XVI's full name is Joseph Aloisius Ratzinger, and he was born on April 16, 1927, in Germany.
- * He was born in the German state of Bavaria in the town of Marktl.
- * His father worked as a cop, and his mother's family was originally from South Tyrol.
- * Joseph grew up in Traunstein and was drafted into the auxiliary anti-aircraft service at the age of 16 near the end of WWII.
- * He studied philosophy and religion at the University of Munich
- * On June 29, 1951, he was ordained as a priest, and in 1953, he was awarded a Doctorate of Theology.
- * He was chosen by Pope Paul VI in 1977 to serve as Archbishop of Munich and Freising.
- * In that same year, he received a position in the College of Cardinals.
- * In 1981, Cardinal Ratzinger was appointed head of the Pontifical Biblical Commission
- * After Pope Paul II's passing on April 2, 2005, the hunt for his successor began.
- * On the fourth ballot, he was swiftly elected during the pope conclave's second day.
- * On April 19, 2005, he assumed his official role as pope of the Catholic Church.
- * Pope Benedict XVI was the oldest person to be elected pope since 1730.
- * He described himself as "a simple, humble laborer in the vineyard of the Lord" in his statement delivered from the balcony of St. Peter's Basilica.
- * He chose his name. Benedict, which means "the blessed," was chosen as a tribute to both Pope Benedict XV and Saint Benedict of Nursia.
- * Pope Benedict XV actively promoted peace while serving as pope during World War I.
- * He brought back several papal accessories, like the traditional red hat and shoes worn in the winter.
- * He was the Pope until he resigned in 2013, at which point he was made pope emeritus.
- * He spoke fluent English, German, French, Italian, Spanish, and Latin.
- He liked Beethoven and Mozart in particular and played the piano.
- * He was a licensed pilot and occasionally piloted the papal chopper to the vacation home.
- * He never acquired driving skills.
