Gratitude

In November, we self-consciously focus on gratitude – more than in any other month. Highlighted on every fourth Thursday in November on every American calendar is the star of the month, "Thanksgiving". But then, also, the month begins with All Saints Day, when we express our gratitude for all those people who have passed into heaven. And there is Veterans Day – when we express our gratitude for those who served in our military forces.

Gratitude is good for us. Psychological studies have found that if you have a grateful personality, "you tend to have increased life satisfaction, happiness, optimism, hope, positive emotion and...less anxiety and depression." (per Jo-Ann Tsang, a psychologist at Baylor University). Intentional reflection on what we're thankful for – through diaries, daily reminders or any other means – helps boost a positive sense of meaning in all aspects of our lives.

And so, here's something to reflect on (per another psychologist, Robert Emmons, from the University of California): "We all begin life dependent on others, and most of us end life dependent on others. If we are lucky, in between we have roughly 60 years or so of unacknowledged dependency. The human condition is such that throughout life, not just at the beginning and end, we are profoundly dependent on other people...

Gratitude is the truest approach to life. We did not create or fashion ourselves. We did not birth ourselves. Life is about giving, receiving, and repaying. We are receptive beings, dependent on the help of others, on their gifts and their kindness."

The letter to the Colossians tells us, "As you therefore have received Christ Jesus the Lord, continue to live your lives in him, rooted and built up in him and established in the faith, just as you were taught, *abounding in thanksgiving.*" (Col. 2:6-7)

Abraham Lincoln was a great leader because he opposed what divided us – slavery – and he fought to unite us. He established our national holiday of Thanksgiving in 1863, in the midst of the Civil War, in order to help restore, "the full enjoyment of peace, harmony, tranquility and Union".

In doing so, he prayed "with humble penitence for our national perverseness and disobedience" that God would "commend to His tender care all those who have become widows, orphans, mourners or sufferers in the lamentable civil strife in which we are unavoidably engaged, and fervently implore the interposition of the Almighty Hand to heal the wounds of the nation."

Accordingly, we are grateful for all those who resist that which would divide us and grateful for that which and those who would unify us in abundant thanksgiving for all the good that God can provide.




